



MINISTRY & DEPRESSION

The language of psychology can be both confusing and frightening. Every day, I hear people talk about their depression, a loved one's depression or a parishioner's depression. If a conversation follows, what is revealed is not always depression, rather a great amount of anger or sadness or fear or a combination of the three emotions. Or, it could be grief.

Depressive disorders may be the most common complaint for clergy (and their parishioners). Many studies comparing clergy to laypeople reveal that clergy carry twice the amount of depression, anxiety, diabetes and other mental and physical issues compared to the laypeople they serve.

This conference is designed to help you – the pastor. It will allow the opportunity for increased self-awareness and to translate that self-awareness into improved health for you, your family and those you serve.

The Beck Depression Inventory (BDI) will be available throughout the day for you to complete. The BDI is a simple, easy-to-use profile that you can self-score and take home with you.
